Dear Mr. Martinez,

This letter authorizes Ensambladores Electronicos de Mexico, S. de R.L. de C.V., Certification No. ED7Y210Y to perform maintenance and modifications on aeronautical products, excluding aircraft, under TCCA regulatory control pursuant to Section B, Paragraph 4.0, of the FAA/TCCA Maintenance Implementation Procedures (MIP).

This authorization is a limited rating for accessories manufactured by Ensambladores Electronicos de Mexico. The work performed must be within the ratings and limitations contained in your 14 CFR Part 145 certificate, operations specifications and capability list dated August 13th, 2021. Any changes applied to your certificate and operations specifications, or capability list will invalidate this authorization and a new authorization request will be required by TCCA.

This TCCA authorization shall remain in effect until the FAA Repair Station Certificate expires September 30th, 2022 or if the certificate has been surrendered, suspended or revoked. In order to renew this authorization, TCCA requires Ensambladores Electronicos de Mexico to provide their renewed certificate, and demonstrate compliance with the MIP Section B, Paragraph 4.1, as part of their new authorization request.
